Returning Scholars Program 2015-16 Academic Year

International Higher Education Support Program Academic Capacity Development Program

Inviting applications for placements in the Occupied Palestinian Territories

The Returning Scholars Program invites applications from junior faculty who are at the beginning of their academic career and have returned or are returning to university positions in Palestine after studying abroad. A Returning Scholar has received an internationally recognized post-graduate degree from a reputable institution of higher education (typically in an OECD country) and has obtained (or will obtain by September 1, 2015) a PhD in one of the following fields: gender studies, human rights and public law, international relations, journalism and media studies, political science, public health, public policy and public administration, sociology, social anthropology, social psychology, and social work.

Returning Scholars teach at carefully selected university departments that are amenable to change and propose a clear and realistic development agenda. Partner departments are identified and chosen by the program through a separate application process.

In order to be eligible for program support, the candidate must be a citizen of Palestine, a faculty member with a long-term contract (3-5 years) at one of the ACDP partner departments, and teach a minimum of <u>four</u> semester-long courses per academic year in that department. An interested scholar already associated with a department that is not supported by the program will either be deemed ineligible or can make arrangements for relocating to a qualifying department. Applicants are also required to prove their proficiency in the English language.

The grant package comprises a monthly stipend and various allowances, including professional development, and is renewable for the following academic year. Returning Scholars and partner departments also benefit from the expertise of supported Academic Consultants who provide scholarly mentorship in such areas as professional development, curriculum reform, research methods, teaching/learning methodologies specific to their discipline, service to the discipline and the community.

Application deadline is June 30, 2015. Grant contracts commence on September 1, 2015, and end on August 31, 2016, with the possibility of renewal for the following academic year.
